

“Water Well Management”

Consider how your life would change if you lost your water supply!

Did you know that a poorly maintained and constructed water well can put your water supply at risk of contamination and reduce your well yield?

If you are one of the 600,000 rural Albertans who get their drinking water from a well, the key to ensuring your water supply is safe and secure is knowing how groundwater works and knowing your well and how to properly maintain it.

Proper water well construction, site and maintenance will help protect your well from biofouling and contamination, save you costly repairs, and ensure your well water yields are sustained over many years.

If you'd like to find out what you can do to protect your well, come to the **free water well management workshop** being hosted by the Pigeon Lake Watershed Association.

The workshop will cover:

- Groundwater—how it works
- Water quality and quantity testing
- Well protection—protecting your well from contamination
- Basic well maintenance
- Well abandonment
